12-MONTH SOLUTION

Engage with the DCPSC as a docket/proposal to collaboratively address the need for multifamily sub-metering and greater utility partnership to overcome capacity barriers for building electrification.

M1: Summarize objective to suggest a panel at DCPSC Energy Summit, convene utilities and MF stakeholders in coordination with ANC.
M2: Assemble Landscape analysis of barriers to capacity and sub-metering+ and consequences.
M3: Submit sub-metering proposal w/ strategies to avoid unintended consequences to PSC and DOEE for Clean Energy DC 2.0.

UPDATES:

 DC Council passed an amendment to the Green Building Act requiring all buildings receiving District funding over 10,0000 sq

NEXT STEPS:

- Revamp the milestones to align with the permanent legislation DC Council will be passing in January 2024
 - A clear pathway for changing policy over next 8 12 weeks
 - Establish a working group of non-DC government members
