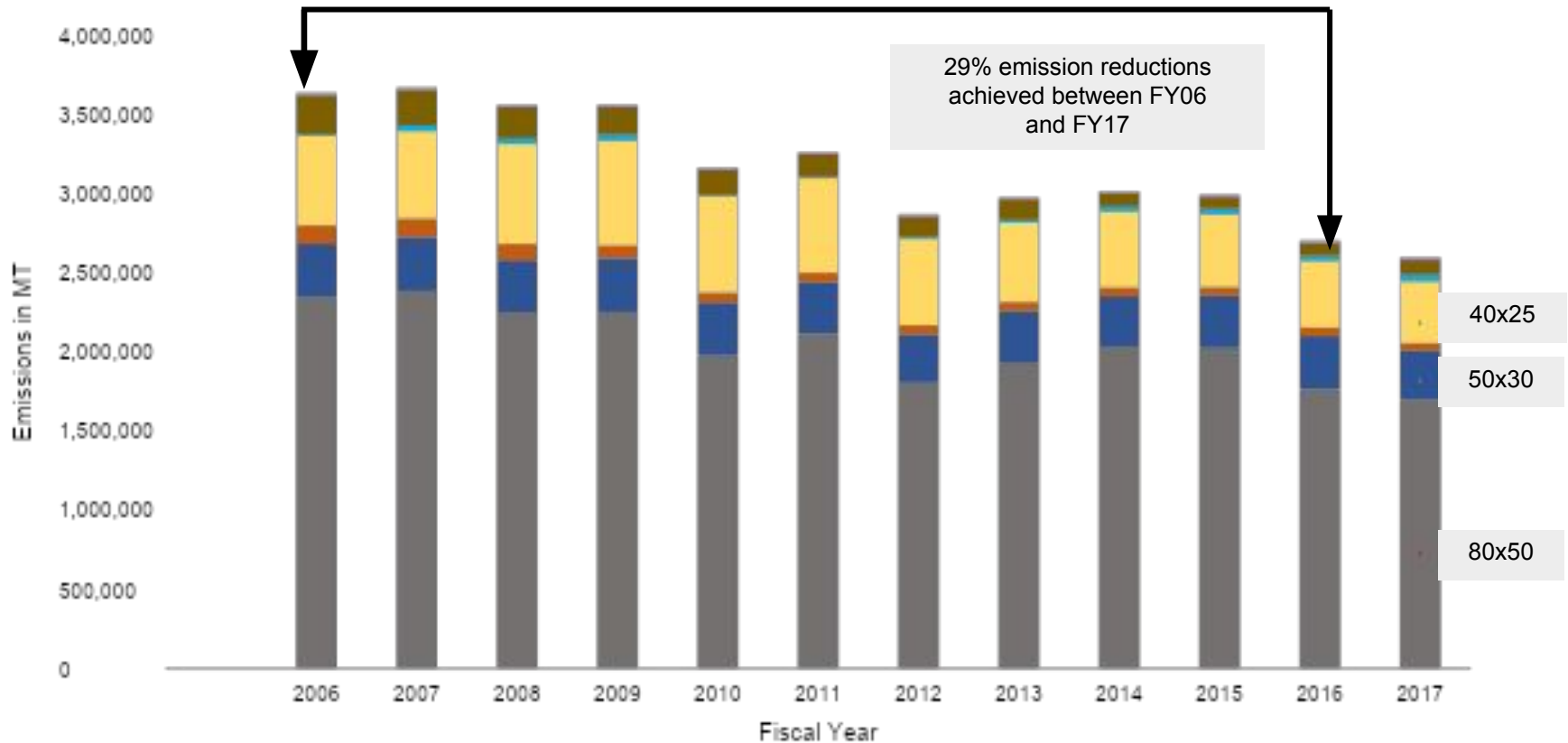

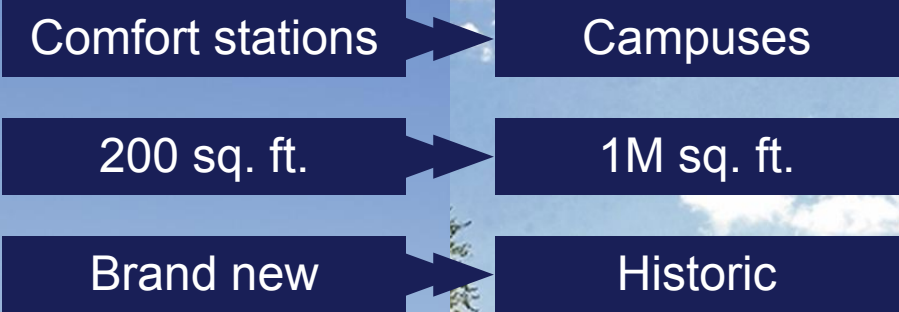
LL97 of 2019: 40x25 and 50x30
