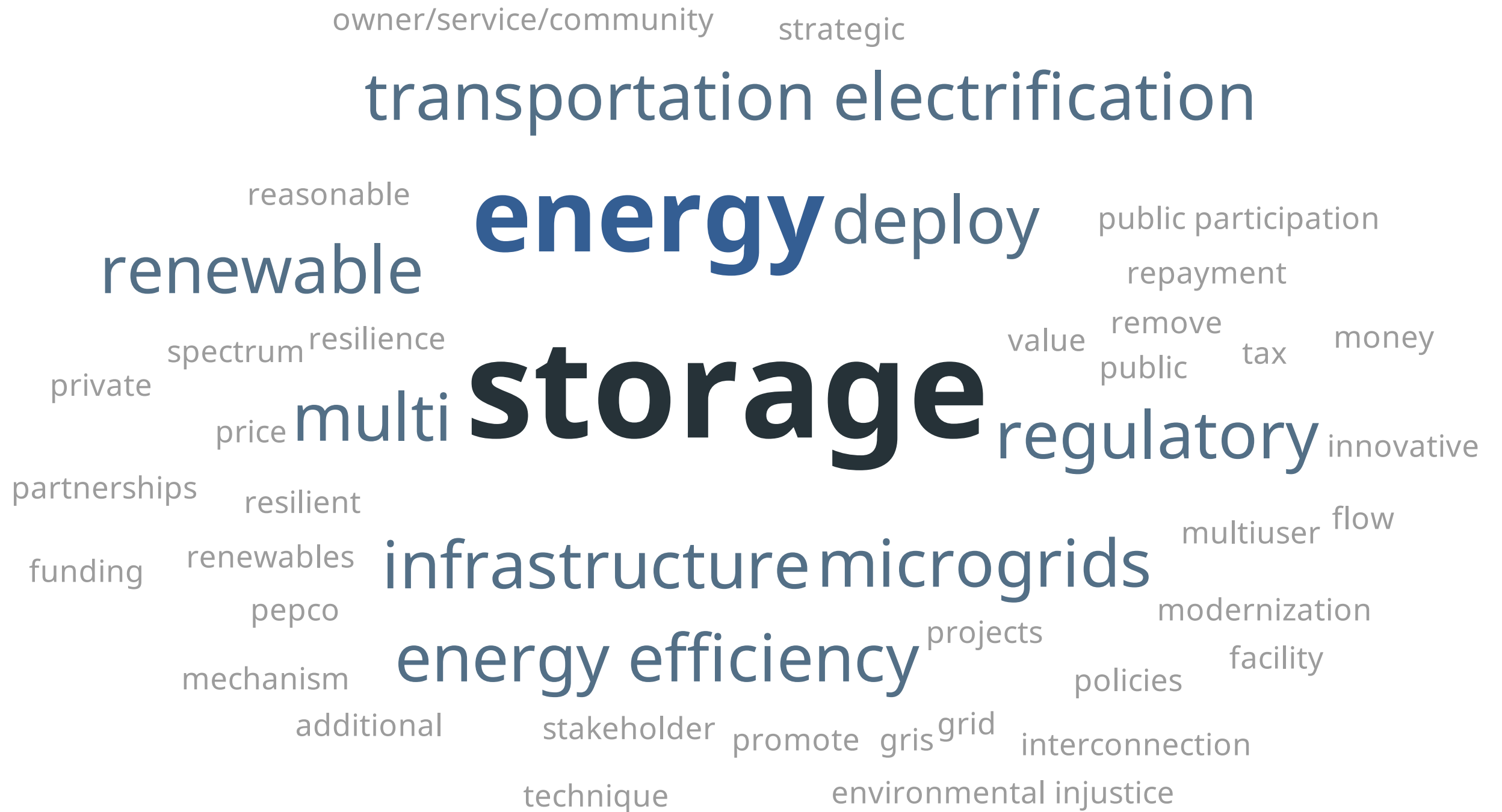

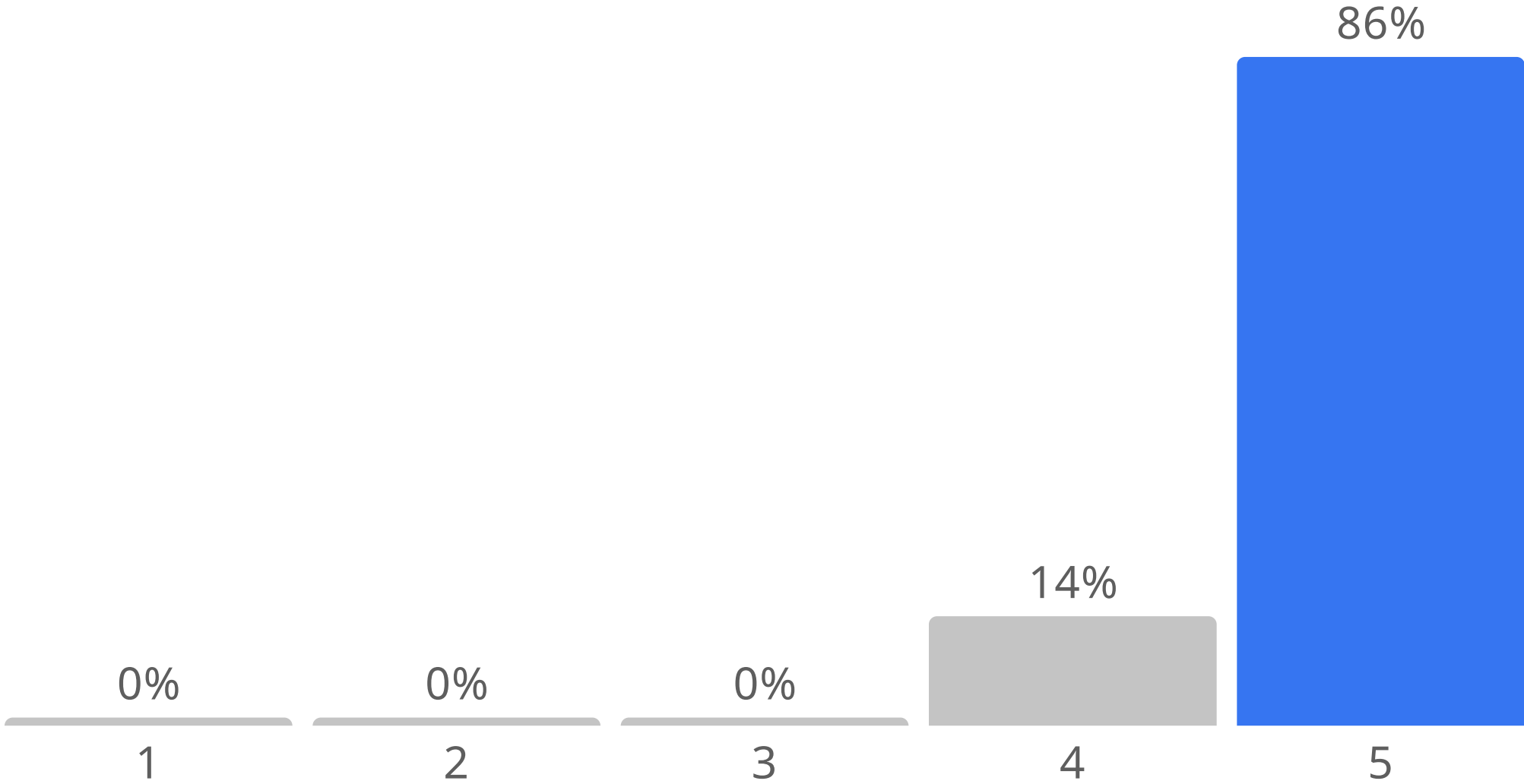
What will have the greatest impact on Washington's decarbonization goal achievement vis-a-vis Resilience, Critical Infrastructure & Microgrids?
