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DERIVED CRITICAL OBSTACLE

Lack of employer supported network of EJ community-based organizations to provide critical support by aligning perspectives, needs, and expectations with clear KPIs.



90-DAY CHALLENGE

Design + deliver a response to the MassCEC workforce design challenge pilot which requires committing funding, finding partners, and appointing coordinators within 90 days.
Task Force goal is to engage partners, employers and community by understanding their needs.

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UPDATES:

- The stated goal is to create a 90-hour program where students will still gain these skills, and the hands-on training will guide students into paid internships. As importantly, internship placement will connect directly with classroom learning and curriculum rubrics.
- These adaptations are critical to expanding the number and type of students served, including high school students in their senior year, unemployed adults, and under-employed and low-wage working adults.

NEXT STEPS:

- Outreach for partnership agreements with YMCA/Boy & Girls Club, Reggie Lewis Center,, South Bay, Open streets, Faith Based Organizations, CDC's Public housing, CBO that work with teens, BCYF community centers, City of Boston programs that work with teens.
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
