# AEG New York 21Q3 Accomplishments

- 1) Established **relationship** with the Hunts Point Produce Market to gain access to the site and vendors
- 2) Partnered with **Nathel & Nathel** to understand energy issues and needs
- 3) Performed a Con Edison site assessment
- 4) NYC DOH assessment on **TRU impacts**
- 5) Built PPT with key facts and figures, barriers, pollutant impacts and recommended next steps
- 6) Task Force member organizations signed **letter of support** NYCEDC Mega and INFRA Grant application to redevelop the Hunts Point Produce Market into a modern and resilient wholesale produce distribution facility
- 7) Kicking off in late September / early October a “**meeting of the minds**” (city, state, federal) collaborative round table meeting to bring decision makers to the table and follow through Governor Hochul’s and Mayor Adam’s shared commitment to transform the Hunts Point Food Distribution Center into a Clean Distribution Hub
