

PROGRESS WITH RENEWABLES

LUMA is working toward a cleaner and more cost-efficient energy future

- Connecting ~3,400 PV customers monthly
- Working with 40 active transmission voltage DER applications of ~100MW:
 - 25 Solar PV ~37MW
 - 18 combined heat and power ~65MW
- Planning to integrate ~1,300MW utility-scale renewables into the grid.
- Initiating the modernization of 300 substations across Puerto Rico
- Promoting large-scale energy storage facilities
- Creating easy access to digital hosting capacity maps and technical interconnection requirements

By increasing collaboration among operators, businesses and key public and private stakeholders, Puerto Rico will benefit from:

- More clean energy and reduced dependence on costly fossil fuels
