

## Resilient Chicago strategy vision


A resilient Chicago is a city where residents, neighborhoods, institutions, and government agencies are successfully connected to each other in the pursuit of economic opportunity, safety, equity, and sustainability.



Goal: Increase Investment in Green Infrastructure (GI) to Reduce Flood Risk and Create More Sustainable Neighborhoods


### **ACTION: Data-driven GI investments**

#### **311 Calls for Flooding – April 17-18, 2013**





A major rain event can result in over 2,000 calls for reporting flooding.



### **Target areas:**

Generated aggregate scoring layer based on the weighted values, yielding 18 target areas

## There is no dedicated "fund" for GI projects

#### Funding sources might typically include some combination of:

- City Open Space Impact Fees (OSIF)
- City Tax Increment Finance (TIF) dollars
- Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) funds
- Funds from other collaborators (CPS, DWM, CDOT, local alderman)
- Grant dollars

## Our challenge

A problem related to Resiliency, Critical Infrastructure and Microgrids that needs a near term solution and requires collaboration is the:

lack of clear, sustainable funding streams for GI projects
